Fact: More than 13% of Americans are Black or African American yet they make up only 5% of clinical trial participants.¹

Fact: More than 18% of Americans are Hispanic/Latino, yet they make up just 1% of clinical trial participants.²

1. When people from all communities participate in clinical trials, we learn how to prevent and treat COVID-19 for everybody.



2. Diversity in clinical trials helps the doctors who care for you and your family learn what works for the people you love.
